

**Canadian and World Issues: A Geographic Analysis Grade 12 University Preparation (CGW4U)**

This course examines the global challenges of creating a sustainable and equitable future, focusing on current issues that illustrate these challenges. Students will investigate a range of topics, including cultural, economic, and geopolitical relationships, regional disparities in the ability to meet basic human needs, and protection of the natural environment. Students will use geotechnologies and skills of geographic inquiry and analysis to develop and communicate balanced opinions about the complex issues facing Canada and a world that is interdependent and constantly changing.

Prerequisite: any University or University/College Preparation course in Canadian and World Studies, English, or Social Sciences and Humanities

**The Environment and Resource Management, Grade 12, Workplace Preparation (CGR4E)**

This course examines the influence of human activities on the natural environment. Students will study ecosystem structures and processes, the ecological impact of human activities, and methods of responsible resource management. Students will apply geotechnologies and geographic inquiry methods to develop and present practical solutions to environmental and resource-management issues. In the process, students' problem-solving and communication skills will be enhanced in preparation for careers and the workplace.

Prerequisite: Geography of Canada, Grade 9, Academic or Applied *CASS, ELSS, WC Eaket, and White Pines only*

**Canadian and International Law, Grade 12, University Preparation (CLN4U)**

This course examines elements of Canadian and international law in social, political, and global contexts. Students will study the historical and philosophical sources of law and the principles and practices of international law and will learn to relate them to issues in Canadian society and the wider world. Students will use critical-thinking and communication skills to analyse legal issues, conduct independent research, and present the results of their inquiries in a variety of ways. Prerequisite: Any university or university/college preparation course in Canadian and world studies, English, or social sciences and humanities *Bawating (alternate years), CASS, Chapleau, Elliot Lake, Korah, SJD and White Pines*

**World History : The West and the World , Grade 12, University Preparation (CHY4U)**

This course investigates the major trends in Western civilization and world history from the sixteenth century to the present. Students will learn about the interaction between the emerging West and other regions of the world and about the development of modern social, political, and economic systems. They will use critical-thinking and communication skills to investigate the historical roots of contemporary issues and present their conclusions.

Prerequisite: Any university or university/college preparation course in Canadian and world studies, English, or social sciences and humanities *Bawating, CASS, Elliot Lake, Korah, Michipicoten, SJD and White Pines only*
